Librada Estrada: Dedicated to Diversity and Development

If you've enrolled in a ToP BBIPOC personal development course with the ToP Network, you may say muchas gracias to Librada Estrada for being a big part of making them happen. Her dedication to bringing diversity and inclusion to the network is clear and something that gives her satisfaction and joy. As the first Latina Co-Chair of the ToP Network board, her work has helped the organization grow and look toward a future of that includes everyone.

Librada graduated from Boston University with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and then went to graduate school at George Washington University where she earned a Master of Public Health in Health Promotion/Disease Prevention. In the year 2000 or so Librada learned about ToP facilitation methods, and like many ToP members, became enamored and set herself on a path to learn more.

Encouraging Librada on her journey was her friend and fellow ToP facilitator, Terri Mills, who introduced her to Deb Burnight. "All roads lead to Deb," said Terri to Librada when it comes to learning ToP methods. With Deb as inspiration, Librada went full speed ahead and eventually opened her own consultancy in 2012. As an Erness Wright Irvin ToP Trainer Fellow, Librada is on the dual training track with ToP, working on the Certified ToP Facilitator (CTF) and Apprentice Trainer programs. Collectively, trainers have donated over \$24,000 for this fellowship program and Librada is taking full advantage of this opportunity to help herself and others.

Some advice she offers to anyone learning about ToP is to give yourself permission to use the methods and learn something new each time you use them. She also says that focusing on gaining confidence in small steps and getting to know folks in the ToP network is important. Librada believes that building relationships with others who are knowledgeable and practicing the ToP methods will help people succeed in their careers and achieve their goals. "The folks in the ToP Network are some of the most generous and supportive people I've ever met,' she said. "Engaging in network activities will provide you an opportunity to experience the methods as a participant and to observe folks using them with real groups."

At The Gathering-2025 virtual participants will get to meet Librada in person and find a vibrant, dedicated facilitator who's excited and eager to go. "I love co-facilitating" she says, "and am excited to be collaborating with Ronda Alexander, the Board, and others for the three sessions. We are working to design interactive workshops that will provide opportunities for folks to share their ideas on how we can continue to grow. I'm also looking forward to being in community with folks that want to expand their facilitation practice."

As you can see, Librada loves to help people and her advice for practicing ToP methods is sound. Her dedication to diversity, equity, and inclusion has made a significant impact to the ToP Network's mission and the membership's development and growth now and into the future. *Muchas gracias*, *Librada!*
